

It is extremely positive how many children at Corpus Christi cycle to school. There are so many benefits to encouraging children to walk, cycle and scoot more regularly to school. It will reduce congestion and pollution around the school gates and it will also help your child's mental and physical health. Teachers find that pupils who walk and cycle arrived at school more relaxed, alert and ready to start the day than those who travel by car.

Bicycle helmets are invaluable when riding a bicycle or scooted. Please ensure your child wears a helmet as they provided the necessary and much needed protection and safety in case of a fall or crash.


