## Volograd Art Competition

In 1944, people from the city of Coventry sent to the residents of Volgograd (Russia) a tablecloth, on which they had embroidered the names of 830 Coventry women and the words "Better a small help than a lot of pity". Together with the tablecloth, the money arrived, which Coventry had raised for the restoration of Stalingrad (city of Volograd) . It was this event that led to the birth of the international movement of twin-towns and sister-cities.

To celebrate City of Culture 2021 students from Corpus Christi entered the Volograd Art Competition with the help of Mrs Bashir. The entries helped promote artistic interaction between young artists in Volgograd and spread the idea of peace and Town Twinning.

We are proud to announce that two Corpus Christi students were successful in securing a place in the Volograd Children's Art Gallery. Everyone at Corpus agrees that the entry very much justifies its place in






