So it obviously includes not sinning - keeping his commandments. But it also includes so much that is positive. When we love someone, we want to enjoy what they enjoy, to like what they like - to share a common vision. So, we are called to genuinely find joy in all that is good - or to trust that we do find joy in such things, but need to nurture it. We are also called to be aware of everything that is sterile in our life - when we fill our minds with rubbish, with things that just numb us rather than re-create us. Everything God made is sacramental - it draws us to God and helps us grow when used as it should be. Maybe have a reflect on how much of your time you nourish your mind with good, and how much time you give to 'stuff'. Could you communicate more and watch TV less? Could you find time for spiritual reading, and less on media? Could you spend more time in prayer and less on facebook and other social media?
