Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

What truly leads us to God fills us with delight. But that doesn't mean it's all plain sailing before or after. The journey of the Magi couldn't have been easy. They would have doubted their understanding of the star, especially when times were tough - maybe causing friction between them. Certainly, arriving at Jerusalem and finding they'd been so wrong about place, would have made them feel they'd been so wrong about it all. And then, they still have to be guided to not trust Herod, and then had to cope with the horror of the slaughter of the Holy Innocents, which was an outcome of their out-manoeuvring him. But, none of that changed the fact that the star filled them with delight - and finding the child Jesus and his mother Mary would have multiplied that joy ten times over.

The Magi are a good example to us in life. We need to remain filled with delight about the things that lead us to Christ. Even when it gets tough, tedious or scary. We will get things wrong in our understanding, but that doesn't make our basic understanding wrong. Following 'the stars' God gives us may lead to more suffering, not less. But it is better to journey in the Spirit, with struggles, suffering and some confusion, but with delight, joy and meaning - than to travel without him and just exist.

And of course, some very important things that lead us to God are each other. Trust God and take delight in each other.

**QUOTES AND GRANTS FOR CC COMMUNITY CENTRE** We have sent all our grant applications off now. it looks like the first one hasn't been successful, but one of the others has suggested we ask them for the full £160,000 that we need, so that's bad news and good news. We won't hear from these remaining three until late March. In the meantime, this week and next week at the latest we are expecting all quotes to come in, so we should have a clear cost figure. Next Monday, I think, is the planning permission meeting at the Council. After we have full costings, we then have to quickly apply for permission from the diocese to spend such money. So, prayers please for all this. I'm confident all this renovation etc. is Our Lady's plan, so I'm quietly assured, but that doesn't mean we shouldn't pray!

Oh, by the way, we will have to severely cut the huge conifers in front of the centre before work starts - not only to avoid structural damage, but also so we can get internet to the centre.

**READERS AND EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS** The Deanery Day for readers is in two weeks - 9.30am - 1pm, Sat 20th January, Christ the King. Fr Marco Egawhary and myself are giving the input. There's Mass and Holy Hour and soup and a sandwich provided. This really isn't optional - if you're a reader in our parish, the expectation is that you will come. The Deanery Day for Eucharistic Ministers is 9.30am - 1pm, Sat 9th March, also Christ the King. This fulfils the promise you made last Maundy Thursday, so please put the date in your new diary!

**PARISH DAY RETREAT** The Parish Council thought it would be good to have a parish day retreat. We have talked about pilgrimages - abroad to Rome, Lourdes or Fatima - or at home, maybe to Walsingham. But we thought we'd start smaller and build up if that's successful. So we've booked a day retreat to Mount St Bernard Abbey, near Leicester. It's on Saturday 14th September, 2024. More details to follow, but please make a note of it in your diary. It'd be great to be able to take a coach or two - and it is only an hour away.

**PRAYER FOR PRIESTS** Please do pray for a few priests in particular. Fr Paul Lomas, who served Atherstone in our deanery, Fr John Lungley and Fr Chris Greaney all died over the Christmas season. May they all rest in peace. Fr Michael Gamble has retired after so many years of faithful service at Bulkington. He has been a real inspiration in perseverance, coping so amazingly with his disability while faithfully serving for so long. Please pray for him as he adjusts to this new stage of his life. And belatedly, please do pray for Fr Des and Fr Sebastian who swapped parishes in Coventry, late last year.

Do remember 2024 is a **Year of Prayer** in preparation for the Jubilee Year of 2025 - focusing on the Our Father - happy to listen to any ideas how we could do this.
