"I am the good shepherd... who lays down his life for his sheep."

It's a beautiful image, of Christ being our Good Shepherd - guiding us, protecting us, leading us - carrying us when need be. It's the reason why surely the most popular psalm of them all is Psalm 23 - the Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want. What deepens the beauty is the truth that our shepherd loves us enough to lay down his life for us, or even just for you. It's this truth that allowed St Teresa of Avila to say, 'Let nothing trouble you, let nothing frighten you - everything passes, love never changes: patience obtains all.

Jesus teaches us that his calling to be our shepherd gives him joy. But he does not cling to it. He calls us all to share in it - to share in the joy of leading others to God. Doing that as a priest or deacon is a uniquely precious way, but we are all called to do it in some way. To be a good co-shepherd - or sheep-dog! - we need to trust in his calling of us, not cling to it, and be willing to suffer for it. Then we become joyful channels of his true shepherding.

Weather permitting, we will simply process to the statue of Mary outside church, singing a hymn or two, then offer her our flowers as our act of filial devotion, and pray 3 Hail Marys. Simples. PENTECOST: MASSES OF MANY TONGUES As we continue to celebrate Easter, we begin to look towards Pentecost - and the renewed outpouring of the Holy Spirit. We have celebrated this through our Masses of Many Tongues - at both churches celebrating the many different cultures of our family, through each playing a small part in the Mass, and by sharing our cultural food afterwards. CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION This year our procession is on Sunday 2nd June - the last day of half-term. As usual, we start at St Anne's, at 3pm (though you might want to drop passengers off, park at Corpus Christi, then walk up to St Anne's, ready). We have 10 minute Benediction there, then process to Corpus Christi - I will get that down to 45 minutes this year! - then 10 minutes in Corpus. After that, we will have a couple of marques out, providing nibbles, drinks and a few seats to help us all have a picnic outside, on the lawn. The First Holy Communion children will lead the procession, in their posh clothes from the day before.
