This weekend we have our Masses of Prayer Partners for our First Holy Communicants. Obviously they do most of their preparation separate from the main parish community, but they are still very much part of our family. One way we can express that is to pray for them. So, at each of the Masses today, each communicant will bring up four prayer cards with their name on, then at the end of Mass we ask you to take one and to pray for that person until Communion Day. Even if you don't get a card, please do pray for all of our young communicants as the big day approaches.

MAY PROCESSIONS On Wednesday we have our two school May Processions. You're welcome to come to the Wednesday 9.15am Mass at Corpus Christi, and then join the children in processing to the school field, and placing any flowers you've brought with you at the feet of Mary's statue. Similarly, you're welcome to come to St Anne's school for 2pm, preferably with a flower, and join in the little procession there to the school statue.

Also, at the end of our Masses on next weekend, we have our parish mini May Processions. Weather permitting, we will simply process to the statue of Mary outside church, singing a hymn or two, then offer her our flowers as our act of filial devotion, and pray 3 Hail Marys. Simples. **Just remember to bring a flower or two!**

CORPUS CHRISTI PROCESSION This year our procession is on Sunday 2nd June - the last day of half-term. As usual, we start at St Anne's, at 3pm (though you might want to drop passengers off, park at Corpus Christi, then walk up to St Anne's, ready). We have 10 minute Benediction there, then process to Corpus Christi - I will get that down to 45 minutes this year! - then 10 minutes in Corpus. After that, we will have a couple of marques out, providing nibbles, drinks and a few seats to help us all have a picnic outside, on the lawn. The First Holy Communion children will lead the procession, in their posh clothes from the day before. It would be great if their family members who came for their great day, could stay over and join in too. **Please put this date in your diary - this year we are due sunshine.**
